Scholarship Information

This document contains information about the organizations that sponsor scholarship awards and their expectations for how student recipients may use the award. It is the student's responsibility to follow their guidelines. Unless otherwise directed by the scholarship sponsor: all scholarships of \$500 or less will be awarded in one installment prior to the fall semester and all scholarships of more than \$500 will be awarded in two installments prior to each of the fall and spring semesters. Scholarship funds are distributed directly to the Victor Valley College Bursar's office for posting to the student recipient's account.

Charles A. Peterson Memorial Scholarship (VVCF Endowment)

The Charles A. Peterson Endowment was established to honor the life of Charles A. Peterson, a well-regarded VVC administrator from 1975-1996, died on November 10, 2001 in an automobile accident in Victorville. Peterson was born on September 5, 1938 in Amery, Wisconsin. He earned both a BS and an MS in Forest Management from Montana State University and a PhD in Forest Management from Oregon State University. He began his career at Victor Valley College as an Associate Dean of Instruction for Occupational Education and eventually became the college's Executive Vice President, retiring in 1996 as the Vice President of Future Development and Technology. Upon his retirement, Peterson began writing grants to help St. Mary Medical Center and drove a van to help people in need of healthcare overcome transportation problems, and was part of an organization known as Future Search which was dedicated to improving local health care. Peterson also enjoyed taking pictures of Native American petroglyphs and pictographs.

Jack H. Harrison Memorial Scholarship (VVCF Endowment)

Jack H. Harrison served in the Navy for 20 years, 18 of those years as a pilot. He served in World War II and the Korean War and received the Distinguished Flying Cross and other medals. After retiring from the Navy, Jack worked for Southwest Gas for 18 years. He and his wife also ran a rental business. From 1967 to 1972, he took courses at Victor Valley College and in 1972 he received his AA in business administration. Jack also believed in giving to the community. During his years in the high desert, he worked with local chambers of commerce to form High Desert Tourist Recreation Committee to help lure tourists to the area. He was a regular contributor to guide dog organizations in the Florida area where he and his wife lived seasonally for some years. Jack was inducted into the Victor Valley College Alumni Hall of Fame in 1997. In 2001, Jack's wife Theresa established an endowment to provide scholarships honoring her late husband.

Lee Harris Fell in love with theatre when he returned to school in 1987. A high school dropout, he returned to become a better writer. He enrolled in stagecraft class to improve his screen writing. After his first two classes, he couldn't wait to get back to class each week. He was hooked.

High Desert Opportunity Legacy Scholarship

A group of volunteers created High Desert Opportunity (HDO) to promote economic growth by presenting a conference that showcases business opportunities in the High Desert. In 1982 the first conference was held at the Spring Valley Lake Country Club, which ultimately moved to the San Bernardino County Fair Grounds in 1985. HDO went on the road in 2016 holding the annual conference at the Victoria Gardens Cultural Center in Rancho Cucamonga. In 2018, HDO joined forces with the Victor Valley College Foundation to bring the conference back to the Victor Valley as the High Desert Opportunity Summit. The annual conference provided attendees with important information about the High Desert cities/town of Adelanto, Apple Valley, Barstow, Hesperia, and Victorville. Economic updates, advantages of doing business in the High Desert, exhibit hall, and well-known luncheon keynote speakers were some of the important elements of the conference. Due to competition with a growing number of economic conferences and a dwindling volunteer force, the HDO board of directors recognized the annual conference had run its course. In order to keep High Desert Opportunity's legacy and mission alive, the board of directors voted to invest in educating future generations of professionals with annual scholarships.

James Marien Memorial Music Scholarship

Captivated since early childhood by the power and poetry of music, James Marien believed that the world could be a less angry place if its disillusioned or confused people could find some answers, hope or direction in their lives by unlocking the chains binding their emotions through either playing or listening to music. Tragically, at the age of 20, James was killed while working behind the counter of a local music and video store. His co-workers and family, supported by the community, initiated this scholarship in his name to carry on his quest by investing in the dreams of others like James who love music

Jonathan B. Hart Scholarship – Ms. Jackie Brown

This scholarship was set up in honor of a young veteran whose love and passion for the Air Force and aviation maintenance earned him The Air Force Achievement Medal. Senior Airman Jonathan Brian Hart found his niche in life working as a Crew Chief on the C5 airplane in the United States Air Force. He attended Victor Valley Community College for the Aviation Technology Maintenance Program. Jonathan was a hard worker and put his heart in everything he did. He volunteered at his former elementary and high school, after graduation drove cancer patients to chemotherapy treatments and comforted those who lost loved ones.

Unfortunately, Jonathan passed away unexpectedly on November 18, 2013, while on Active Reserve Status. In order to honor the memory of Jonathan, an endowment fund was established to assist students at VVC with the cost of FAA Written and Oral Examination (\$400-\$1,200).

She believed strongly in the value of a college education, and would have been so happy to have this opportunity to make a student's dreams come true. This scholarship is awarded to a student who is working during college.

Mary Danielle Weingarten Nursing Scholarship (VVCF Endowment)

This scholarship was established as an endowment to forever honor the memory of Mary Danielle Weingarten. It is awarded to students pursuing careers in the nursing field.
